Two new economuseums are must-sees. The London-Wul Farm provides a fascinating insight into the ancient art of hand spinning. Here you can see the entire process, from the Angora rabbits, sheep and goats that provide the fibres, to the washing, dyeing and spinning that produce the colourful creations. Bourgeois Farms offers a wide range of apple, pear, cherry and wild blueberry products. This family business involves the visitor in all the seasonal aspects of the farm, including an Apple Blossom Festival in the Spring, and of course picking your own apples in the Fall.

Visitors to Moncton have long enjoyed first-class golf. This year, a fourth signature golf course is added to the list: Fox Creek Golf Club is another wonderful reason to spend some time in Moncton. The esteemed Graham Cooke, one of Canada's most successful golf course architects, designed the course; it will wow any golfer, novice or pro alike.

And there are also the well-established reasons to enjoy Moncton. Like Magnetic Hill, Magic Mountain Water Theme Park and the award-winning Magnetic Hill Zoo – all perfect family day venues. Moncton's festivals beckon as well. The Atlantic Seafood Festival brings several days of culinary heaven, which include famous chefs, competitions, and children's events. The Atlantic National Automobile Extravaganza features over 1,700 antique cars and the Shediac Lobster Festival needs no introduction; don't miss the Festival des Cerfs-Volants (Dieppe Kite International) in August too, with 17 countries represented this year.
